- Good knowledge of MyFaces, SVN, Maven, Hibernate, Spring, Tomcat, and SQL
- Development environment: Windows XP and Eclipse
- Integration environment: Unix
- Working languages: English and/or French

Location, timing, and length of the traineeship

The traineeship will be based in Strasbourg and will start on 1 January 2013. The start date can be adapted.

The traineeship has a minimum duration of four months. It can be extended for a period left to the Ombudsman's discretion, normally up to a maximum of 12 months.
