




UlrichsWeb.com can be found among the databases via "Search your subject" on the library site.


UlrichsWeb.com is a database that acts as an encyclopedia of various journals and newspapers. UlrichsWeb.com contains information that will tell you if a periodical title (not the article itself) is peer-reviewed. We can therefore use UlrichsWeb.com to verify that the articles have been published in a scientific journal. Note that there is no guarantee that the article itself is scientific as there may be letters to the editor pages and other such pages in the journal.

When using UlrichsWeb.com, try to be as specific as possible with the title of the journal. Our recommendation is that you enter the ISSN (International Standard Serials Number) or the exact title when searching for the journal.

Among the icons to the left of the journal title, you will see a tiny "referee" shirt. When the symbol appears, it means that this journal title is refereed or peer-reviewed. Remember, refereed and peer-reviewed mean the same thing.



Tip! If you click on the SFX box in a database, a link to the journal title in UlrichsWeb.com will be displayed. If you click on the Ulrichweb.com link, you will be directed to the record for that journal title. This will tell you immediately during your research whether or not a journal title is peer-reviewed.
