The call for presentations is now open!

The fourth Åre Risk Even (ÅRE) will take place in Åre, Sweden, on June 14-16. The conference organizers are inviting proposals for presentations and/or posters on the topic of this year's conference: *Resilience: Opportunities and Challenges for Societal Crisis Management and Individual Safety*.

The conference aims at gathering researchers, practitioners, and delegates of private, public, and volunteer organizations for the exchange of knowledge and experiences. The program though preliminary at this stage, comprises lectures and scientific presentations, as well as workshops and the sharing of experiences in smaller groups. This means that as a researcher, you do not only get inspiration from other researchers, but also from professionals in the industry who might have different perspectives on research questions and methodology.

Please include your name, your institutional affiliation and contact information and let us know whether you are giving an oral presentation or a poster. We will send notification emails regarding the acceptance of abstracts on March 22, 2016.
