

PUBLISHING CONDITIONS

1. DiVA is the university's publishing platform.

DiVA is a technical environment provided by the university where authors can upload scientific documents. For example, DiVA can be used for self-archiving of journal articles.

2. By uploading a text in DiVA, the author makes it publicly available.

The expression "publicly available" means that the text is available to basically anyone, including the research community. The author retains copyright and the public's use of the information in DiVA is regulated by the Copyright Act. (See paragraph 9.)

3. The author warrants that s/he is the copyright holder and has the right to publish the text in DiVA.

Because the author does not transfer any part of the copyright, the university/DiVA has no liability for any violations of the copyright regarding the author's work. The university only provides a platform, which means that the author is "the publisher" in DiVA.

4. If the work is part of an examination, the author warrants that it has been approved for publication.

Theses, degree projects and the like need approval before publication in DiVA. According to university regulations, all of the university's theses (doctoral and licentiate) should be submitted to the university library in electronic form, preferably by uploading it to the university/DiVA. Texts of this type cannot be changed (or deleted) without the author first contacting with the University.

5. Publication in DiVA is non-commercial in purpose.

The university does not charge the author for publication in DiVA. The author is not entitled financial compensation from the university for the publication in DiVA. The university is not entitled to charge for the public's use of the author's work in DiVA.

6. The university is entitled to remove the author's work from DiVA if the author violates the publishing conditions.

In accordance with the university's instructions on publishing in DiVA, the author must read and agree to the publishing conditions. This is done by signing this document.

7. Anyone publishing a full text in DiVA is liable for all authors of the work have been informed of the publishing conditions.

This paragraph regulates the distribution of responsibility when the work has several authors and when someone other than the author registers the work in DiVA.

8. The author may waiver parts of the rights of disposition of the work.

By providing the work with a special license, e.g. Creative Commons, the author can give users the right to use the work to a greater extent than stated in the Copyright Act.
